It is an important opportunity for children to become familiar with new routines, expectations, and learning environments, helping ensure a smooth and positive start when they return in the new academic year.

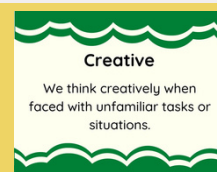
